The following condition shall be added to the requirements of the Development Plan:

“Non-native, invasive species, such as those identified by the California Invasive Plant Council (<http://www.cal-ipc.org/>) shall not be used for landscaping, or removed if currently present to the maximum extent practicable. Areas of the Streamside Management Area (SMA) and wetland buffer that are devoid of trees and shrubs are ideal areas for re-vegetation planting using native species. The SMA and wetland buffer delineated by the split-rail fence shall be maintained as open space and only development consistent with Section 3.30.B.3.b shall be allowed.”
